

New unchanged edition / reprint / printing : how to process in WorldCat

Question: Does a new, **unchanged** edition, reprint, or printing of a resource require a new record?

Answer: See Bibliographic Formats and Standards. 4 When to Input a New Record (under 250 Edition Statement):

Edition statements appearing on some non-English language publications (e.g., French, Spanish, Italian, Portuguese, German, etc.) reflect printing information rather than edition information. If the edition statement appears in conjunction with the printer's name or the number of copies printed, generally consider the edition statement to reflect printing information and use the existing record. In all other cases, use judgment. If in doubt, do not create a duplicate record, use an existing record.

Advice:

For modern, post-1801 publications, interpret 'printing', 'ongewijzigde herdruk', etc as printing information – regardless of whether a printer, or number of copies printed, is mentioned or not.

Use the existing record for the relevant edition.

If a library wishes to record the 'printing', 'ongewijzigde herdruk', etc information for that item, LHR-level is the appropriate place.

Recording the Edition and/or manufacture statement in the Marcrecord

At BIB level:

Marctag 250, Edition Statement: see RDA 2.5.2.

Example OCN 573322803 (BIB-level)

The library's copy¹ has a 2nd reprint-statement, without date, on reverse of titlepage: there is no edition statement in the book

Example OCN 262504675 (BIB-level)

Library's copy² has edition statement: 2e, geheel bijgew. en uitgebr. dr., 3e opl., and dates: 2008 and 2009.

250 \$a 2e, geheel bijgew. en uitgebr. dr.

260 \$a Amsterdam :\$bMets & Schilt,\$c2008.

At LHR level: *not obligatory*

The edition statement has been recorded at Bib level; now record the 'printing', 'ongewijzigde herdruk', 'reprint', etc. statement in 843 \$d + \$n (if needed also: \$b+\$c).

Mtag 843, Reproduction Note

At this moment Mtag 843 isn't shown in Discovery. Therefore a library may want to add the same information in a note to the relevant Item-identifier in 876 (which is shown in Discovery), until the presentation of LHR-tag 843 is realised in Discovery.
